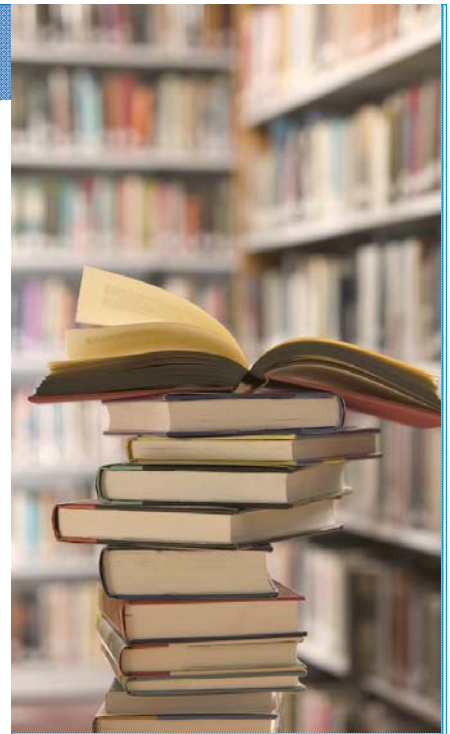
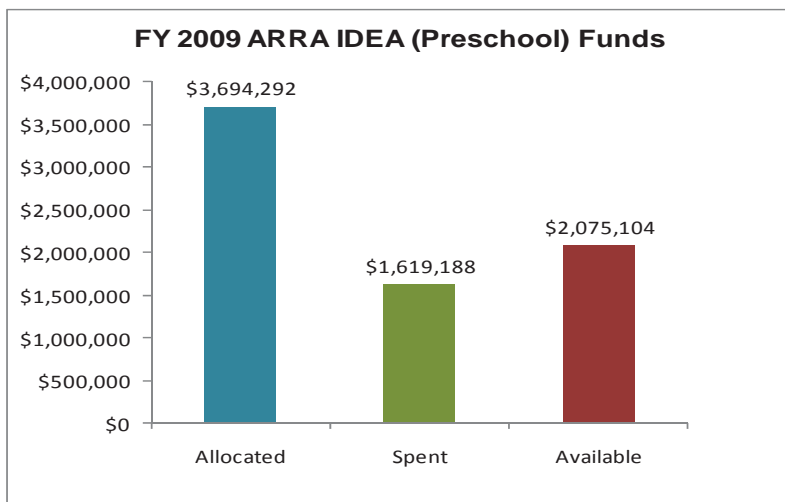
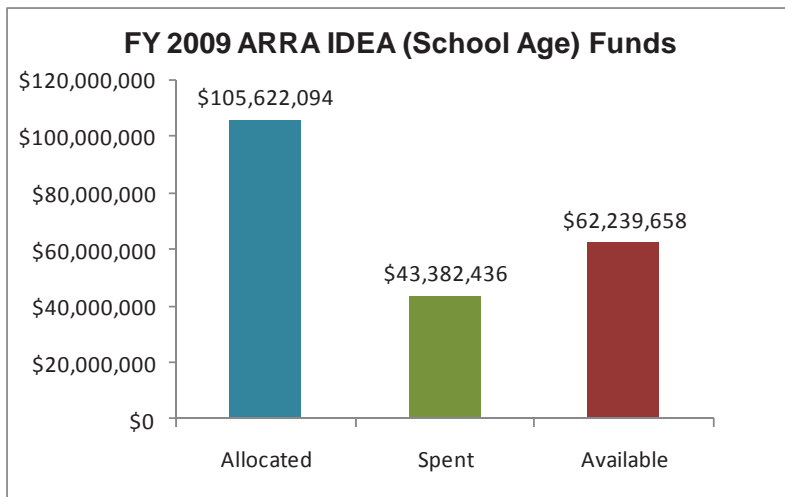

## ARRA FUNDING AVAILABLE

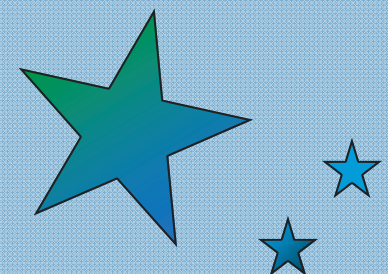
For FY 2009, \$109,316,386 were provided through the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 (ARRA) for Utah programs under Part B of the IDEA. As of February, 2011, the USOE has received requests for LEA reimbursement totaling \$45,001,624, which leaves \$64,314,762 remaining to be spent **prior to September 30, 2011 and reimbursements requested by October 25, 2011**. 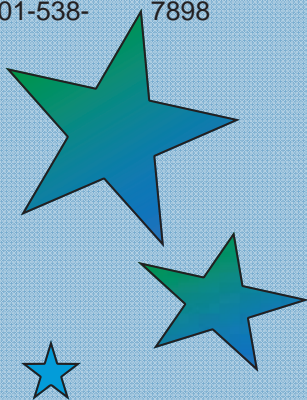

This year 6<sup>th</sup> Grade Language Arts and Biology Criterion-Referenced Tests (CRTs) must be assessed on the computer-based assessment system. LEAs can still request Braille and large print assessments for these two assessments. The teacher of any student requiring a paper-based 6<sup>th</sup> grade language arts or biology CRT should contact Wendy Carver at [wendy.carver@schools.utah.gov](mailto:wendy.carver@schools.utah.gov) with the request. There are no answer documents for these two CRTs and the student responses will have to be input into the computer-based system by the teacher or the student. The Text-to-Speech tool is available for both of these assessments via the "screen reader" accommodation. Teachers may also read these assessments aloud to students, but the Text-to-Speech tool is recommended. Students should be given the opportunity to practice the Text-to-Speech tool via the CRT student training tests which are now available. Contact the LEA assessment director for help accessing these training tests.

## KNOW YOUR OPTIONS

### **Utah Benefits Planning Assistance and Outreach Program (BPAO)/ Work Incentive Planning and Assistance Program (WIPA)**

The Utah Benefits Planning Assistance and Outreach Program (BPAO)/ Work Incentive Planning and Assistance Program (WIPA) helps people on Social Security disability understand how working impacts their Social Security and other benefits (including Medicaid, Medicare, food stamps, housing, and many others).

The Social Security disability and other public benefit programs can often be complex and hard to understand and navigate. The Benefits Specialist or Community Work Incentive Coordinator (CWIC) can:

- ◆ Help people on Social Security understand Social Security and other benefit systems, what to expect, and what they need to do when there are changes in their employment status.
- ◆ Help people on Social Security learn about various work incentives available, and which ones they may be eligible for.
- ◆ Provide information about other programs and community resources that may also be helpful.
- ◆ Correct misinformation and provide accurate benefits information about each person's unique situation.

This is an important service for students with disabilities as they exit the public school system. Students and their families need to understand the possible impact of employment on benefits; BPAO Benefits Specialists may be available to speak to parent/student groups about benefits, employment, and the availability of work incentives.

These services are provided at no cost to the beneficiaries through a partnership between the Social Security Administration (SSA), Utah State Office of Rehabilitation (USOR), the Department of Workforce Services (DWS), and the Work Ability Utah Project.

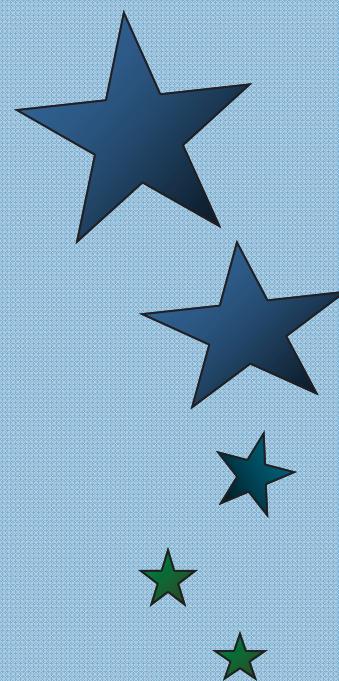

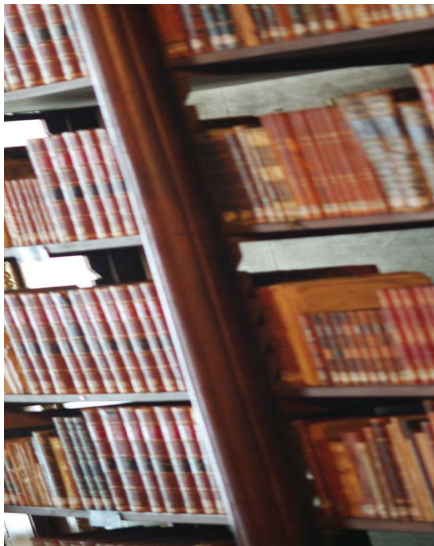

## RTI CORNER

Progress monitoring, an important step to inform instruction, is the ongoing process of collecting and analyzing student data to determine a student's progress in the instructional or intervention setting.

Some questions that a school based team might ask when making data collection decisions.

1. What type of data will be collected?
  - ◆ Duration
  - ◆ Quality of product or performance (important as Utah moves toward the Common Core performance-based assessment).
  - ◆ Fluency
  - ◆ Frequency or rate
2. Where will the data be collected?
  - ◆ Classroom
  - ◆ Cafeteria
  - ◆ Playground
  - ◆ Job-site (secondary specific)
  - ◆ Other relevant situations/places
3. How often will data be collected?
  - ◆ Daily
  - ◆ Weekly
  - ◆ Monthly
  - ◆ Quarterly
4. Who will collect data?
  - ◆ Classroom teacher (general or special educator)
  - ◆ Job coach
  - ◆ Paraeducators
  - ◆ Instructional coach
  - ◆ Reading/Math coach

Whoever collects data should be provided quality professional development to ensure fidelity in the collection and analyzing data being used to determine progress. The progress being monitored or determined can be on specific skills or general outcomes for students in a classroom or school.

## COMMON CORE

To help understand the ELA Common Core, you may wish to read the three appendices. The appendices that will help with your understanding are:

1. Research supporting the key elements of the standards.
2. Literacy text examples and sample performance tasks.
3. Samples of student writing. This section provides an idea of the expectation of students in relation to the strong focus on argumentative writing in the Common Core.

At the USOE website <http://schools.utah.gov/core/> is the alignment or “gap analysis” of the existing Utah ELA Core to the Common Core. Also, elementary mathematics “crosswalks” are available to identify what is in the existing Utah Mathematics Core as compared to the Common Core. The **Core Academy** for the summer of 2011 will focus on ELA K-5, 7-12 and Math 6 & 9. Each LEA will be allocated a specific number of slots. LEAs will decide who will be filling their allotted slots for the **Common Core Academy** trainings. Special Education Directors can work with their individual Curriculum Directors to ensure that special education is represented in both the ELA and Math Common Core Academy trainings.

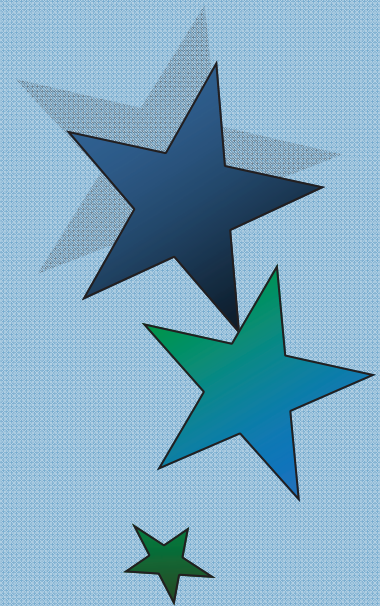

## SB150 AND BOARD RULE R277-403 STUDENT READING PROFICIENCY

LEAs must identify and report any students in grades 1,2,3, reading below grade level, including those with significant disabilities. USOE identified DIBELSNext as one measure in addition to at least one other assessment for determining grade level. One of the “multiple assessments” to determine “grade level” for students with significant cognitive disabilities (a student who takes the Utah Alternate Assessment-UAA) **need not** be the DIBELSNext Middle of the Year DORF. When an LEA reports the number of students reading below grade who are receiving interventions, for significant cognitive students the IEP could be identified as the intervention.

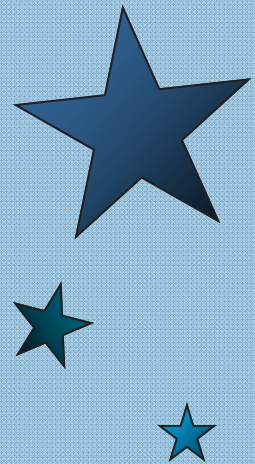

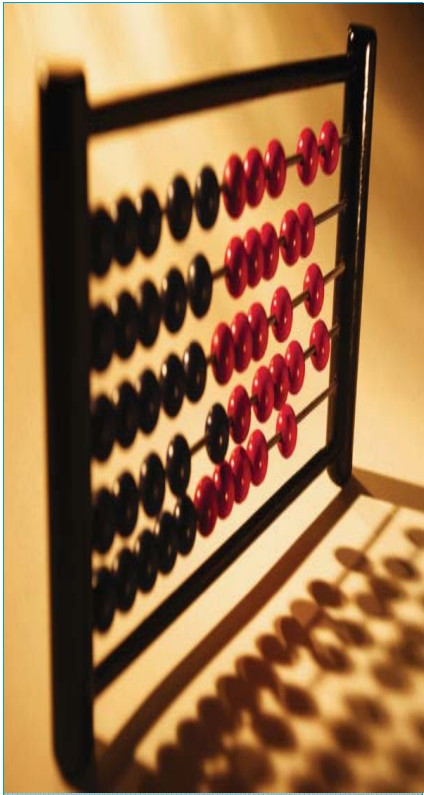
